

Lynette Bundy Corbeil, DVM, PhD

Lynette Corbeil received the DVM degree from the Ontario Veterinary College, University of Toronto in 1962 and the PhD degree from Cornell University in 1974, under the mentorship of Alex Winter. She taught and/or conducted research at OVC, Mason Research Institute, Southeastern Massachusetts University, Cornell college of Veterinary Medicine, School of Medicine University of California San Diego, Kansas State University and Washington State University, both in Veterinary Medicine. Many graduate Students and Postdoctoral fellows were trained.



Most of her research focused on pathogenic mechanisms and immune protection in bovine respiratory and reproductive tract infections, especially trichomoniasis and *Histophilus somni* infections. Over the span of her career, Dr. Corbeil has trained a large number of veterinary and graduate students, postdoctoral fellows, and visiting professors. Most of the scientists she has trained and influenced have presented their work at CRWAD and have continued to attend and contribute to CRWAD. In working with these students, Dr. Corbeil encourages researchers to pursue discoveries important to them and share those discoveries with the world.

Dr. Corbeil is an outstanding scientist and has remained actively involved in CRWAD. She was the first woman elected to the CRWAD council and later served as Vice-President and then President of CRWAD. She has also served as past President of the American Association of Veterinary Immunologists (AAVI) and was awarded the AAVI Distinguished Immunologist award.
