Paul S. Morley, DVM, PhD, DACVIM, is an epidemiologist, animal scientist, and veterinary internal medicine specialist whose career has produced seminal contributions to the research of infectious disease pathogenesis, antimicrobial resistance, infection prevention in veterinary hospitals, and exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage in horses. His agricultural research has focused on applying state-of-the-art approaches to advance the sustainability of animal agriculture and support a safe, abundant global food supply. Dr. Morley earned bachelor's degrees in animal sciences and veterinary science and his DVM from Washington State University. He then completed internship and residency training in veterinary internal medicine at the University of Saskatchewan, where he earned his PhD in veterinary epidemiology. He has held faculty appointments for more than 30 years at The Ohio State University, Colorado State University, the Colorado School of Public Health, and Texas A&M University.



Dr. Morley is the Sally Rau McIntosh Endowed Chair for Veterinary Strategic Initiatives at Texas A&M University and a recipient of Washington State University's Lifetime Achievement Alumni Award for Excellence in Research and Teaching. Over his career, he has secured more than \$22 million in research funding and published more than 250 peer-reviewed journal articles. He has served as the major advisor for 19 PhD and 13 master's degree students, participated on 50 graduate student committees, and mentored 20 postdoctoral trainees and numerous junior faculty.

As an active member of the Conference of Research Workers in Animal Diseases (CRWAD) for more than three decades, Dr. Morley first presented at the conference in 1992 and has authored more than 185 CRWAD abstracts since then, most of which were presented by his graduate students and postdoctoral trainees. His sustained commitment to CRWAD reflects a career dedicated to rigorous science, mentorship, and service to the research community. He has served the organization in numerous leadership roles (2011–2025), including Executive Council Member, Vice President, President, Past President, inaugural Program Committee Chair, and Executive Director. He was also a long-standing leader in the Association for Veterinary Epidemiology and Preventive Medicine, serving on its board of directors and as President, and was the founding organizer of the Calvin Schwabe Lifetime Achievement Award. Through decades of leadership and stewardship, he has played a central role in advancing CRWAD's scientific mission and fostering the development of early-career scientists.
