The Department of Pathobiology consists of faculty with strong research programs in the infectious diseases of humans and animals caused by viruses, bacteria, fungi, and parasites. We are seeking an exceptional investigator using innovative approaches to study fundamental biological questions in the immunology of infectious disease. Minimum qualifications include a Ph.D. or professional degree, along with postdoctoral experience or research-oriented residency training.

The candidate must have an exceptional publication record in leading peer-reviewed journals, a well-defined research vision along with teaching experience. The candidate will be expected to establish and maintain an innovative, extramurally funded research program, and possess the skills to collaborate within a vibrant community of basic and veterinary clinical scientists. Teaching at the graduate and professional level is expected. A minor service appointment is required to support the department and larger academic communities.
